Rabbi Geller's High Holiday Message

Despite my obvious familiarity with the dawning of yet another Jewish New Year, each and every 12-month span I still continue to be struck by the utter incompatibility of our sober religious customs and outlook versus the unbridled secular hilarity with which we greet January first's wintery blast. Nevertheless, the extensive prayer, fasting, and self-evaluation of this year's coming Ten Days of Awe will almost certainly entail some degree of added emotional roller coaster.

Primarily because both Reform rabbis in our own local Jewish community (yours truly as well as my esteemed colleague Rabbi David Weis) having completed a full generation of service to their respective congregations are now intending to become emeritus retirees. One of my Hebraically learned and witty congregants offered to cleverly translate this “*I'dor va-dor*” generational transition – with all due deference – as “in one era, out the other.” Perhaps that gentle humor can soften the almost inevitable guilt feelings about 5780 being my culminating High Holiday service after nearly six decades (including five different New Year pulpits while a rabbinic student at Hebrew Union College.)

Guilt, of course, in accord with the Jewish tradition Sigmund Freud ostensibly spurned, is the *sina qua non* of civilized life. A spiritual axiom which suggest the fierce psychiatric debates I can still recall from my pre-med college days of yore. Those analysts who denigrated guilt as a destructive form of self-hate versus the doctors who affirmed feelings of responsibility as the indispensable sign of noble conscience and *menschlichkeit*. To my way of thinking, the great 20th century sage Abraham Joshua Heschel honed in on the vital essence of the matter when he taught: “The cure of the soul begins with a sense of embarrassment (i.e. guilt); embarrassment at our pettiness, prejudices, envy and conceit, embarrassment at the profanation of life.”

Speaking of profaning life, I am editing this High Holiday message on one of the darkest dates in Jewish history. Namely Tisha B'Av, the very same day when both ancient Temples in Jerusalem were destroyed, six centuries apart, by the now vanished empires of Babylon and Rome. Today the epic biblical tragedy known as the Book of Lamentations is mournfully chanted in the synagogue by fasting congregants. The authorship of this dramatic elegy is incorrectly attributed to the prophet Jeremiah who blamed this national catastrophe not on the moral failings of the common people (as does the real author of Lamentations) but rather the sinful corruption of Judah's King.

Jewish tradition agrees with the Prophet of Sorrows by teaching “Where there are no leaders the people perish.” Words of admonishment that ring bitterly true in our present American era of climate-warming denial, racial divisiveness, mass shootings, and cruel family separation at our Southern border. Yet despite all these discouraging headlines, it remains a Jewish New Year that will soon be upon us. To personally shrug our shoulders in despair would constitute the most un Jewish action and attitude possible. Which is why the Book of Lamentations (along with every other prophetic reading on Shabbat) must end on a similar note of hopeful affirmation: “Turn us unto You O Lord and we shall repent.”

Rabbi's Ruminations

Blast-off!

The month of September starts with Labor Day, a last gasp of summer before real life intrudes on our warm weather idylls. The month of Elul starts with a blast...of the shofar!

The sounds of shofar are an entirely different kind of intrusion. If we let them, the varied tones of shofar can make us pause; they can inspire us to consider what we do — for whom and to whom; they can tie us to a tradition that dates to antiquity.

The biblical calendar begins with Nisan, the month in which we commemorate Pesach. Torah tells us that the first day of the seventh month is to be observed as *yom t'rua*, “a day when the horn is sounded.” (Numbers 29:1) No reason is given; no instruction about how many sounds or when in the course of the day it should be sounded. No qualification is defined for the one who would blow the horn.

The sages of old, in their zeal to fill in the details absent from Torah, created our current practice of shofar on Rosh Hashana: the variety of tones (*teki'a*, *shevarim*, *t'rua*), the number of times each tone is to be heard, the duration of the notes, and more.



In our tradition, all we need to do is hear the sounds of shofar. We are to be moved by them. We are to be chastened by them. They are meant to inspire inner contemplation, determination to effect positive change in our lives, motivation to seek atonement from mortals and from the Eternal.

In the Rosh Hashana liturgy we read, “The great shofar will be blown, and the sound of a delicate silence will be heard.” Loudness — greatness — certainly gets our attention. It can also encourage us to hear the quiet, to appreciate silence.

The power of a song, a symphony, of a page, a painting, of a pronouncement, a poem, lies as much in the spaces between notes or words, the between colors or shapes, as it does in the notes, words, colors or shapes themselves. The power of shofar can be found in the sounds and in the silences, if only we listen.

Watch for this year's “Elul Blast” emails, words of seasonal inspiration, and come to hear the shofar at every weekday morning service, sounds of seasonal anticipation, beginning September 1.

Cantor's Message



Elul is the twelfth month of the civil year, the sixth month of the ecclesiastical year in the Jewish calendar. We set the month apart for repentance, or *teshuva*, in preparation for the upcoming High Holidays.

The Hebrew letters that make up the word Elul are *aleph, lamed, vuv, and lamed*. It was during a recent wedding I officiated the phrase *Ani l' dodiv' dodi li*, meaning "I am to my beloved as my beloved is to me." I then recalled that the letters in Elul were one and the same. I remembered learning that this beautiful phrase represents our relationship with G-d and is compared to our relationship between a bride and groom.

"The month of Elul represents the time that Moses spent on Sinai preparing the second set of tablets after the idolatrous incident of the golden calf. As is told Moses ascended on Rosh Chodesh Elul and then descended 40 days later the 10th of Tishri, the end of Yom Kippur, when the repentance of the people was complete. The month of Elul therefore represents the time of national sin and forgiveness obtained by means of *teshuva* before the Lord."

May this New Year be filled with peace, good health, and happiness. *L'Shanah Tovah!*
