Rabbi's Ruminations



"Let There Be Light!"

A dazzling gleam greeted us when we opened the sanctuary ark on Rosh Hashana morning! Restored and polished

silver Torah ornaments, along with the white High Holy Day Torah mantles, reflected the respect due our sacred scrolls.

Every week, I get a close-up view of the beautiful *aron kodesh*, the Torah ark, in the sanctuary. Over the last year, I began to pay attention to the silver Torah ornaments — crowns (*ketarim*) and finials (*rimmonim*) — and realized that many of them were in woeful condition: Some were misshapen, parts were missing, dents abounded, tarnish and dust dulled the luster.

Thanks to the generosity of some of our regular Shabbat service attendees, many of the ornaments have been restored. restoration covered ten of the ornaments, largely from the sanctuary. Another ten items, including from the chapel ark, need some tender care. You can help with this project by donating to Shirat Hayam (specify/memo "Torah Crowns"); all donations to this restoration of honor project are welcome!

Over time, the elastic in most of the Torah binders had lost its stretch. Sarah Chaikin contributed her sewing skills — and lovely



fabric — to make enough velcroclosure binders (no elastic!) to secure all our Torah scrolls.

Finally, the High Holy Day table covers in both main sanctuary and chapel were beyond their expected life span. Refurbishing was not an



option. Thanks to a grant from the Shirat Hayam Men's Club, new white covers were commissioned



from Diane McCarthy (Cathleen Kunkle's mom!). The glowing soft satin-finish covers are embellished with an embroidered off-white Shirat Hayam logo; they are understated and beautifully-made enhancements to High Holy Day services.

Cantor Wolbransky's Message



HANUKKAH

Hanukkah commemorates the victory in 164 BC of a group of Jewish people (the Maccabees)

over the Syrian Greeks, who had been occupying the Land of Israel since before 167 B.C. Not only had the Greeks destroyed the Jewish Temple in Jerusalem, but they also banned the practice of Judaism entirely. After a threeyear fight, the Maccabees liberated the Temple—and won the Jewish people the right to practice their religion.

Scholars believe the first Hanukkah celebration was actually a belated celebration of Sukkot, a weeklong holiday that typically takes place in autumn. When the Maccabees prevailed over the Syrian Greeks, they wanted to celebrate important holidays they'd missed during the Maccabean Revolt. Even though it was early winter, they celebrated Sukkot as they rededicated the Temple. (Sukkot was never again celebrated in the winter; it went back to being a fall holiday.)

The Jewish people continued to celebrate the Temple rededication annually, but it would take another 250 years before Hanukkah came to be known as the Festival of Lights, a term coined by the ancient Jewish tradition of referring not to a lighting of lamps but to enlightenment—as in a newly acquired freedom to worship. Either way, the notion stuck. Plus, when asked their thoughts on "What is Hanukkah?"

many people associate Hanukkah more with the miracle of the oil than with the rededication of the Temple.

With so much darkness in the world right now, especially with everything going on since October 7, it's so important for us to come together, and we need the light of the menorah to shine through the darkness. "In this moment in the world, we often think that we need to go to our own corner, that we are all in it ourselves... but we need to see the light in all humanity, and all the individuals that call this earth home."





This award acknowledged that his many contributions and dedication have enhanced the excellence of surgical care and overall standards of the SMC community.


