"Rabbi's Ruminations

SHIRAT HAYAM GOES TO ISRAEL!



Israel has been a bit like a punching bag since October 7, 2023. Its actions in response to a heinous and barbaric attack

have been decried, its supporters have been vilified, demonization of Israel and attempts to ostracize Israelis has come from all corners of academia. What do we do? It's time to visit!

The 30 people who had registered for our Israel trip scheduled to leave on October 29, 2023, were a mix of first-time travelers and veterans of at least one prior visit. The itinerary covered most of the "basic" touch points — religious pilgrimage sites (e.g., Western Wall), natural wonders (Dead Sea), spiritual aura (Tzfat/Safed) — and many more sites and sounds and smells and tastes.

I had added to the base itinerary things like a presentation about an Israeli/Arab elementary school, a private a cappella group performance during Shabbat dinner, and a talk about liberal Judaism in Israel. We were also keeping tabs on evening concerts and dance performances that fit into our travel plans.

We had titled the trip "Israel Experience."

Within a week or so of October 7, it became painfully apparent that the military response to the unprecedented attack on Israel by Hamas, a Palestinian terrorist group, would be fierce and possibly long-term. Regretfully, we canceled the trip.

Well, IT'S BACK! Our new

itinerary is even better than before, with the addition of a few off-the-beaten-tourist-path opportunities. We will include briefings on current events and presentations about the trauma of the war and Israel's remarkable resilience; a visit to one or more of the attack sites that are becoming memorials.

I believe that participants on this trip will gain a deeper understanding of the highs and lows of living in Israel, its military and diplomatic challenges, the astonishing successes of this little country, the wide variety of Jewish religious expression, and much more. We will again be watching for concerts and other special events.

I expect, as Ellie and I felt when we visited in May, that these days, visitors are more than mere tourists; we were connections to world-wide community, supporters in the midst of challenge, Zionists when that term is used as a pejorative. We were family.

This trip will be an experience of Israel that explores history, confronts reality, engenders pride, and affirms solidarity with our people's sovereign state.

Cantor Jacki's Message

THE ROAD TAKEN: A JOURNEY TO THE RABBINATE*

As a child I always had conversations with G-d. My family always wondered who I was talking to, but that never bothered me.

Some time ago, I discovered a long lost cassette tape from 1972 found among my father's belongings. After a process of digitization, I was shocked to hear the voice of my seven year-old self joyfully singing Hebrew songs for Hanukkah. My father's beautiful baritone voice illuminated the darkness like the brilliant candles that must have been set before us.

Not long after this time, my parents divorced and much of the Jewish ritual of my early years faded to the background. We left our heavily Jewish enclave on Long Island in the late 1970s to be close with my maternal grandparents in Plantation, FL. In those days the neighboring city of Davie was known to have KKK presence. Some kids at my new middle school were openly antisemitic and I struggled to make sense of my new environment.

By the age of 14 my religion became the world of musical theatre, my *nusach* (prayer modes) jazz motives and my call to embody the Prophetic principles instilled by my activist parents was found on stage through the performance of cutting edge drama.

I have always been drawn to many



voices and many cultures. During my early years, I realize now that I was pluralist in the making. As an independent thinker I have

always been led by a strong belief in personal autonomy.

Years later, I found myself living in the UK after a stint with the Royal National Theatre in London. There, during my twenties, while immersed within the creative circles of the London theatre scene, I was called by dear friends and colleagues all of whom were from a variety of backgrounds to respond to the events in the Middle East during the early days of the First Intifada. Since I was the only Jew in the group, they sought my perspective.

But I couldn't answer. In fact, the deeper I probed my own beliefs, my own Jewish identity felt as unformed and void as Genesis chapter 1 verse 2 (הָיָתָה לֹהוּ נָבָהוּ hayta tohu vavohu).

During my subsequent wandering to find Jewish connection, I found myself years later on the second day of Rosh HaShanah 1996 / 5757 at the West London synagogue. It proved to be a pivotal moment for me. I heard the *eitz haim hi* prayer. It was one prayer that I recognized from my childhood and it was chanted beautifully by a synagogue choir. I had never heard anything so glorious. I stood and wept.

After eight years spiritually adrift in the UK, I returned to the United States with one goal, to discover more about my Jewish self. This journey led to me to

Central Florida and Congregation of Reform Judaism in Orlando, where I was assured by Rabbi Steven Engel that I had been in fact, living my life Jewishly, but there was always more to learn. I enrolled in a newly formed adult b'nai mitzvah cohort, struggled as an adult through the *alef bet*, I served as an interim soloist, then cantorial soloist, until I was accepted by the Hebrew Union College - Jewish Institute of Religion Debbie Friedman School of Sacred Music (HUC-JIR DFSSM) Cantorial Certification program. I became an invested cantor in 2007 after four years of study while serving the congregation.

As my role as co-clergy in the synagogue deepened and my Jewish communal life expanded, I began to feel that my calling to the cantorate was actually one step towards the rabbinate. I have been a full member of the American Conference of Cantors (ACC) since 2007 and served on its Executive Board for ten years. As a passionate advocate of social justice issues grounded in Jewish values, I served on the Core LeadershipTeam of the Religious Action Center (RAC-NJ) and as an ACC liaison to the URJ Commission on Social Action. I currently serve as co-president of the South Jersey Board of Rabbis and Cantors.

I am dedicated to the pursuit of religious pluralism in Israel and an advocate for deeper connections between Jewish Movements in North America. I strive to develop new ways to approach, invigorate, and create meaningful connections and understanding between people of all faiths.

Life & Legacy: An Idea to Explore

You've worked hard and planned for retirement. Now, you can leverage your retirement assets to benefit you and your family, reduce federal taxes, and support Shirat Hayam into the future.

When you designate Shirat Hayam as the beneficiary for all or part of your IRA, 401(k), or other qualified retirement plan, those assets go to the synagogue free of tax. However, when those assets go to your heirs (other than your surviving spouse), they are subject to federal income tax. They may also be subject to federal estate tax (depending on the value of your estate) as well as various state income, inheritance, and estate taxes.

Under the SECURE Act, most non-spousal beneficiaries will be required to withdraw all "inherited" retirement plan funds within 10 years. For many heirs, this will make the tax consequences even greater. Because retirement plan assets are typically the most highly taxed assets when you pass on, they are the ideal choice for charitable gifts. You can then designate other assets to your heirs.

You can request a change-of-beneficiary form from your plan administrator, complete it, and notify Shirat Hayam. For more information, call Judy Galler.

Home visits can be healing, and a visit from one male to another may be a welcome distraction.

Activities such as playing cards, watching sports, or talking about current events can be most appreciated. These visits are intended to make a person feel encouraged and cared about, and may put a smile on someone's face.

Some guidelines: please call first to see if, and when, visits are welcome. Keep in mind that mornings and evenings may be difficult for the person you are visiting. If you see the congregant tiring, it is time to leave. Of course, if you are ill, save your visit for another day.

Bennett Weinberg will be called to the Torah as a Bar Mitzvah on Saturday, March 15. His Torah portion is Ki Tisa.



SPOTLIGHT ON

CHARLOTTE JOSEPHS



Charlotte Josephs was born and raised in Atlantic City. A graduate of ACHS and Glassboro State Teachers College (now Rowan University), she had a multi-faceted working career, which includes teaching 2nd grade, working at the State Employment Office, and teaching water aerobics. As a volunteer, Charlotte

worked for Literacy Volunteers of America, teaching reading.

Charlotte met her husband, Daniel, when he was in sixth grade and she in fifth. They dated in high school, attended different colleges, and in 1949 were married by Beth Judah's Rabbi Jolt. They became parents to three children, Mark z"l, Jeffrey, and Donna, Charlotte's caretaker. After 43 years of marriage, Daniel, her loving husband, passed away.


