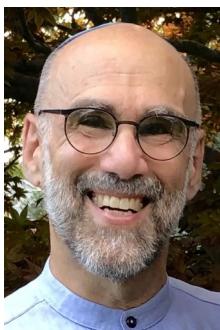

p'rachim k'tanim

Because we now qualify, I will be attending a conference in June for small Conservative

congregations. What's "small"? 250 or fewer member units. The conference is called "*p'rachim k'tanim*" which means *little flowers*. I get it: *A compact botanical specimen may have the same intricacy, features and beauty as a larger blossom, just at a smaller scale.*

In my final year of rabbinical school, I served a tiny congregation in southern Maryland. How tiny? 35 member units in what was, effectively, a one-room shul/school/social hall/meeting space.

It was an uplifting year of twice-monthly weekends, 4.5 hour drives (each way). I usually invited congregants to join me for Friday night dinner (that Ellie and/or I cooked in the synagogue kitchen), then services Shabbat morning and Sunday school. I got to do a baby conversion and naming, and had other new-for-me experiences. The community was there largely because of a Naval Air Research Station which accounted for the great proportion of engineers in the congregation. When something needed fixing, instead of pulling out phones, they would pull tools out of car trunks and pickup truck beds!

In my first years of serving Beth Judah I learned that just as a large blossom and a smaller flower have the same components, however

differently-sized, so a large synagogue community can face the same challenges (and enjoy similar rewards) as one a tenth its size!

At the Small Congregations symposium I expect to learn what others have done to adapt and thrive. Joe Rodgers, our incoming president, is also attending the conference. Sensitive to the inexorable changes going on here and across the country throughout our movement, he too is seeking insight and ideas.

I hope that we will return feeling that it was a Conference of Big Conversations Among Small Congregations, and that those exchanges — even the more intimate of them — offered ideas or suggestions that inspire us to improve what we do with and for you, our congregants.

It's one thing to hear from experts and to speak with other clergy and lay leaders who share our circumstances. It's another to hear from you, our constituents, about how we can make your experience of the Shirat Hayam community even more fulfilling and uplifting. *Please talk with us, make suggestions, offer to help make things happen!*

Even small congregations can think big.

LAG BAOMER:

LAG BAOMER is celebrated on the 33rd day of the Counting of the Omer, which occurs on the 18th day of the Hebrew month of Iyar and is the period

between the second day of Passover and Shavuot. Modern Jewish tradition links the holiday to the Bar Kokhba Revolt against the Roman Empire (132-135 CE). In Israel, it is celebrated as a symbol for the fighting Jewish spirit and is celebrated with large parties taking place throughout Israel and observant Jewish communities around the world and the lighting of bonfires representing the light of Rabbi Bar Yochai's teachings, igniting the world.

Our annual *Lag BaOmer* event will take place on Friday, May 16 at 6:15 PM. There will be a Dairy Potluck and S'mores! All ages are welcome! RSVP to Elaine Geller by May 12. Conservative services begin at 5:30 PM, Reform services are 7:30 PM with dinner being held between services from 6:15-7:30 PM.

SHAVUOT 2025 (JUNE 1-3)

Shavuot or "The Feast of Weeks" is one of the three Biblical agricultural festivals, along with Passover and Sukkot. It is celebrated on the 6th of Sivan in Israel, and the 6th and 7th of Sivan in the diaspora. According to the Torah, it took seven weeks for the Israelites to travel from Egypt to Mount Sinai. The name Shavuot, meaning "weeks," refers to this seven-week period. Shavuot is most widely known as the Jewish holiday that commemorates the day God gave the Torah to the nation of Israel at Mount Sinai.

On Sunday, June 1 our congregation is joining with Beth Israel to present a PSALM PSLAM program that will include fresh perspectives on Biblical text as prose, poem, song, and story as well as a delicious dairy dessert buffet. See the PSALM PSLAM advertisement for additional details.

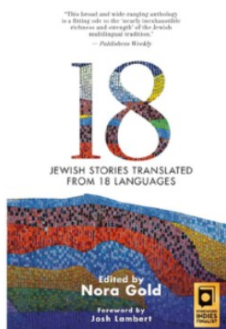

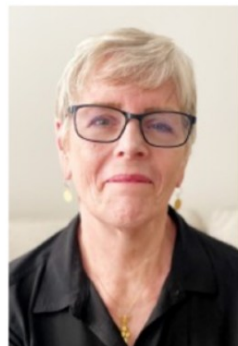
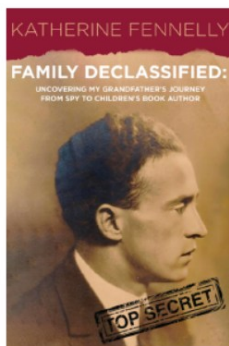
